Madison Fetes Graduates

Pinning Exercises

College Will Graduate Seventy-Six From Eight Major Courses

The pinning ceremony for the graduating nurses was held in Helen Funk Assembly Hall on Thursday evening, August 13, at 7:30 p.m.

Miles Roy Coon delivered the address and Dr. R. L. Pettis, Jr. gave advice to the twelve graduates.

At this ceremony the following persons received School-of-Nursing pins, to signify that they are graduate nurses: Margaret Dixon, Maureen Drake, Esther Edmonson, Shirley Hancock, Clyde Holland, Marie Holland, Albert Isom, Doris McKee, Jean Openshaw, Leah Rodríguez, Pat Wells, and Alyce Faye Williams.

The other nurses who are being graduated this weekend had finished their work in March, took their State Board examinations in April, and have their pins because they are already R. N.'s.

Seventy-six degrees, diplomas and certificates will be presented to those individuals completing eight different courses of study, Saturday evening, August 15, at the annual commencement service of Madison College. Graduation services will be held in the Helen Funk Assembly Hall.

Thirty-five will receive Bachelor of Science degrees; eleven, diplomas in Nursing; ten, diplomas in Anesthesiology; ten, certificates in Medical Records Technology; one certificate in X-ray Technology, four, certificates in Elementary Teacher Training; three, certificates in Physical Therapy; two, certificates in Medical Technology.

Elder Donald W. Hunter, president of the Ohio Conference of Seventh-day Adventists, will begin graduation weekend by speaking at the Friday evening consecration service.

The Sabbath morning baccalaureate sermon will be delivered by Elder Lawrence Scales, president of Southwestern Junior College at Keene, Texas.

Alumnus Joins Staff

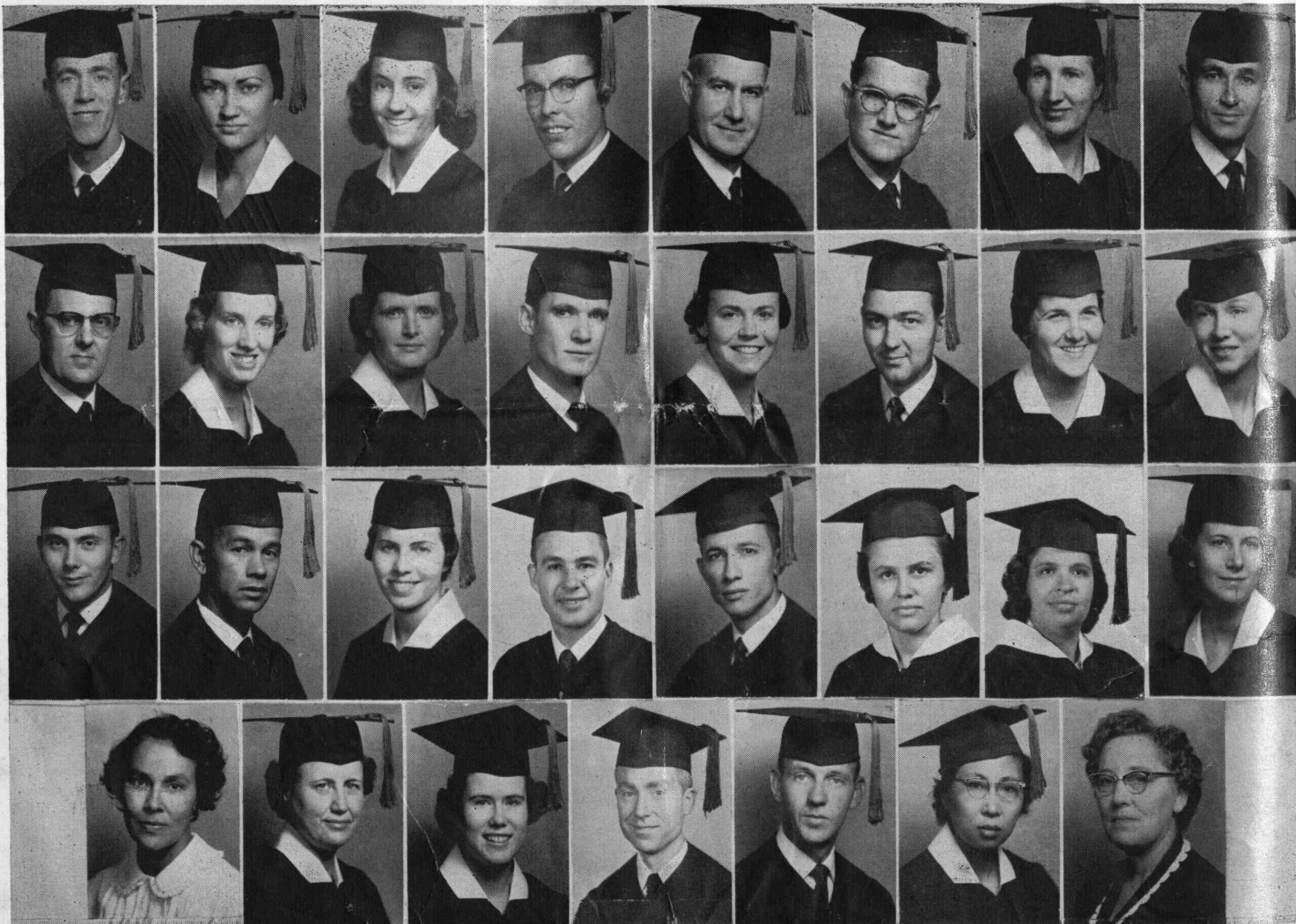
In a recent issue the MADISONIAN announced the employment of Wallace (Scotty) Slater, a former student, as pharmacist.

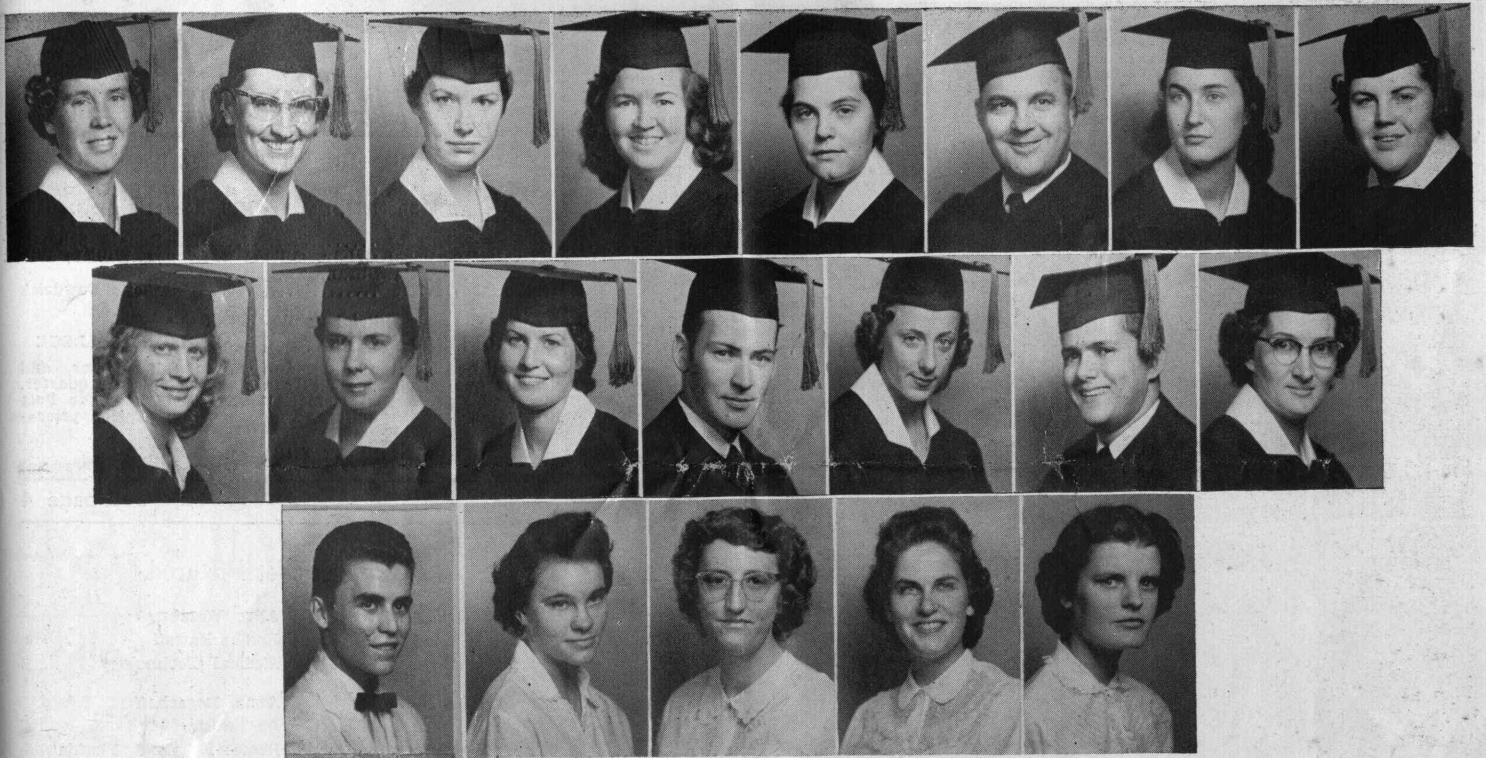

Bible Department Sponsors Evangelistic Campaign

The medical-evangelistic campaign conducted by the summer quarter evangelism class closed its ten-night crusade on July 28. The meetings, held in the Fatherland Street Church in Nashville, were a success and three will be baptized, according to Mr. Norman R. Guley, teacher of the class and director of the campaign.
 Side by side, fundamental Bible truths and health principles were presented each evening. Student members of the team, many of

them nurses, brought health tips to the people. Dr. Roy R. Bowes presented facts on lung cancer and showed the film "One in Twenty Thousand." Dr. Gilbert Johnson explained the physiology of digestion and gave practical pointers on how to live healthfully. Mrs. Felix A. Lorenz and Dr. Perry A. Webber, nutritionists, showed the relationship between eating and health by presenting scientific facts. Mrs. Norman R. Guley, R. N., showed how to pre-

pare hot compresses, and Mr. L. L. Dickman, first aid instructor, demonstrated a number of first-aid procedures.
