

## THE PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

## "LENGTHEN THY CORDS"

In this last hour of earth's history, God has a special message for His church and His people. The prophet Isaiah saw clearly the work which we are

to do today. The message is, "Lengthen thy cords and strengthen thy stakes" (Is. 54: 2, last part). This message is directly connected with the great commission of our Lord and Master, "Go ye therefore and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Sond and the Holy Ghost" (Matt. 28: 19). Then how thankful we can be that we have the direct promise of Jesus to each one of us: "Lo I am with you always, even unto the end of the world" (Matt. 28: 20).

Following are the goals which we have before us as a people here in South America and around the world: That the glory of the Lord might be seen upon us; that we might have a close walk with our Lord and Master; that we might then arise and shine; that we might go to every nation, kindred, tongue and people; that we might lengthen our cords and strengthen our stakes until the work is finished.

Some years ago we launched a program which was directed to two great regions of the South American continent. One was the great, teeming cities around the coastal areas of the continent of South America. The other was the great interior and jungle areas. We have often referred to these areas as the asphalt jungle and the green jungle.

God has helped us mightily as we have sought to advance on these two challenging frontiers. In the great metropolis of Sao Paulo we now have over 9,000 members, and it will not be long until we have 10,000 members. Sao Paulo is on the east coast of South America. If we look across the continent, to the west coast, we see how God is blessing as we are entering the big cities there. One great city in the highlands of Peru is Arequipa, which is really the gateway to the highlands of Peru and also the gateway to the coastal areas. In a great city-wide effort held by Pastor Arturo Schmidt, associate secretary of the Division Ministerial Association, we have received word that in one evening 700 decisions for baptism were made. Some 1,200 people each evening have been listening to the gospel message at the five thirty o'clock meeting and at the eight o'clock meeting. In the city of Rio de Janeiro a great auditorium seating some 1,500 people has now been erected as an evangelistic center. Soon meetings will begin under the direction of our Division Ministerial Association secretary, Pastor Enoch Oliveira. As I am writing these lines, a great and intensive effort is being opened in the city of Montevideo, Uruguay. Pastor

En la ciudad de Río de Janeiro acaba de ser erigido un gran centro evangelistico con capacidad para unas 1.500 personas. Pronto comenzará allí un ciclo de conferencias bajo la dirección del pastor Enoch de Oliveira, director de la Asociación Ministerial de la División. Mientras estoy escribiendo estas líneas, se está gestando un grande e intensivo esfuerzo en la ciudad de Montevideo. Uruguay El pastor Salim Javas. evangelista se está gestando un grande e intensivo esfuerzo en la ciudad de Montevideo, Uruguay. El pastor Salim Japas, evangelista de la Unión Austral, que ha celebrado con notable éxito ciclos de conferencias evangelizadoras tanto en la América del Sur como en la del Norte (Los Angeles, California), dirigirà este esfuerzo. La encuesta que se està realizando revelo que más de 7.000 personas manifestaron interés en conocer la solución de 7.000 personas manifestaron interes en conocer la solucion de los graves problemas sociales y morales de nuestros días. Estamos contentos de que, con la ayuda de Dios, podemos penetrar en la gran selva asfaltada. En las grandes urbes a menudo abundan la miseria, los corazones quebrantados, las huelgas y la simiente revolucionaria. Debemos llevar a los millones que habitan en las grandes ciudades la esperanza del advenimiento.

Nuestra próxima tarea consiste en penetrar en el interior nuestra proxima tarea consiste en penedrar en el interior del continente. Dios nos ayudó grandemente en la región del Amazonas, donde mediante nuestra flota de lanchas médicomisioneras hemos podido ganar en un solo año —el año pasado— unas 400 almas. Nuestras clínicas rodantes también ayudaron a miles de personas a conocer la verdad en alguna medida.

Durante los últimos cuatro años hemos estado estudiando y desarrollando un nuevo programa consistente en emplear alas para apresurar la predicación del Evangello en las zonas selváticas del interior. AREQUIPA is the second largest city of Peru, situated among the mountains at an altitude of 2,700 meters (about 8,100 ft.), with a population of approximately 250,000. The Adventist church has been established in this city for years and we have about 200 church members there.

On January 17 a school of evangelism was opened with 30 workers in attendance, largely graduates of Inca Union Junior College also a number of young workers from the Lake Titicaca and Central Peru Missions. Classes were given for two hours each day, the writer teaching the following subjects: evangelism, modern comparative religions, and application of the **Church Manual**.

In connection with this school of evangelism, on February 1 a series of meetings was begun in the Danubio theater. The Lord blessed us from the beginning in an extraordinary way, and our first words of thanks go to God for this outpouring of the Holv Spirit. The firts two nights the public crowded in to such an extent that it was necessary to hold two meetings, and until now (March 31) we are still carrying on this program in order to accommodate all who come. One lecture is given at 5:30 and the other at 8:00 in the evening. At this writing we have already given 63 lectures during February and March. We have also had one meeting at 10:30 Sunday mornings in addition to the two per night. We know that an average of 1,200 people attend every night since we are keeping record of the attendance.

Sunday, March 17, we held our first baptism in the theater, and 18 persons were baptized. At the close of the ceremony a call was made to those who desired to pre-

pare themselves for baptism in the future, and for the glory of God, more than 1,000 persons responded to the call and signed a decision card. Our hearts are overflowing with happiness as we contemplate the future and the enormity of the task which the Lord has placed in our hands. It is the plan of the evangelistic team to have baptisms every Sunday night. On March 24, 17 persons were baptized and about 600 people signed the decision cards. Until now 100 people have been baptized. We are expecting a rich harvest of souls for the Lord Jesus. Until the end of April we plan to continue the meetings in the theater and from then on, we hope to organize five churches -but we have no church buildings!

Leonardo Pinedo, a ministerial intern, is studying with a family consisting of father, mother, and four children. They have come to all the meetings. They became acquainted with the Adventist church only a few days before the first baptism was held, and with tears in their eyes, came to the pastoral room asking to be baptized that same day. When they were told they would have to wait a little while, the father was rather disappointed, but then he understood that certain arrangements have to be made before a person can be baptized. The next morning

the man spoke to me and manifested his spiritual joy and peace and his desire to be baptized the following Sunday. The wife, with tears in her eyes said that the Lord had appeared to her in a dream and had told her she should unite with our church through baptism.

God is working miraculously. This is another interesting case. In a personal interview, a doctor of philosophy stated the following: Her life had changed. Before it had been a vale of tears filled with family problems. Through the announcements which appeared, she heard about the lectures on happiness, and against the wishes of her family, began to attend, together with her two children. The gospel entered her heart and she told me, "Four days ago I stopped crying. I have a new philosophy of life and I am a happy woman." After witnessing the baptism she said she wanted to prepare herself to be a good Christian.

At the close of every meeting a friendly, attractive couple comes to talk to me, and last Sunday nigth the husband told me with tears in his eyes, "Every nigth I come I am more and more convinced of the error in which I was living and I thank God He is opening my eyes and we are learning the truth." A number of young people, among them university students, when the baptism was over came forward to tell me they had heard the sweet voice of Jesus speaking to their hearts and that the baptism was the most solemn moment of their lives. They wanted to study and prepare themselves to be good Christians.

We thank God for this gracious outpouring of the Holy Spirit in response to our earnest desire. The Arequipa church, together with the workers in the school of evangelism, spent two Sabbaths in fasting and prayer, asking God to manifest His power. The first Sabbath was the one before the meetings were to open and the second was the Sabbath before the first baptism. The meetings began at sunset Friday and it was touching to see our church filled with our members









Many children like Peter of our story are evidences of miracles of God wrought through the skill of Christian physicians.

ATE one afternoon Peter was brought into the hospital in a semicomatose state. Two days before this little lad had been severely burned by upsetting hot water over himself. One-third of his body surface was burned, but his parents did not realize his danger. When his temperature began to soar and he began to lose consciousness, they brought him to the doctor at Andrews Memorial Hospital in Kingston, Jamaica.

Being a person who loves children, Dr. Leon's heart went out to this suffering little one. If only they had brought him in sooner!

"I'm very much afraid that it is too late for any treatment we can give to help your little boy," the doctor told the anxious parents trying to prepare them for the worst. "However, we will do all we can." He hesitated, then added slowly, "I doubt if he will make it through the night."

Peter was admitted quickly, and all the latest possible burn therapy was instituted-drips, injections, and dressings. Dr. Leon drove to the coolness of his home in the hills where he usually was able to relax and throw off the cares of the day-but tonight he was worried about little Peter. He questioned, "Was there anything more that I could have done?" Yet, he knew he had done everything humanly possible. He decided he could only leave the case in the hands of the Lord.

In the meantime, the nurses were keeping a close watch on Peter. Pulse, respiration, and temperature were taken frequently and were increasing alarmingly. Suddenly the nurse noticed a turn for the worse, and feeling sure the little boy was dying, sent another nurse

to call Dr. Leon. It was a twenty-minute drive to the hospital from the hills, but he made it in record time. Emergency stimulants were administered, for it seemed the little boy mas alredy gone. However, he railied a bit. Then, after leaving further instructions, the doctor again headed for home. Twice more during the night the little fellow was at the point of death, and twice more the doctor made the trip back to the hospital. Twice more the little lad rallied.

The next morning when the parents returned, the doctor told them, "He has come through the night by a miracle of God. There is a slight possibility than he may yet pull through."

A couple of days later as he left the child's room, he met the parents in the hallway. "Peter just smiled at me," he reported with a big smile on his own face. "He's out of danger at last. We thank the Lord, and can be glad that medical science has developed better methods of treating burn cases during recent years."

The parents were grateful, so grateful that a few days later the following notice appeared in the daily newspaper:

"The parents of Peter wish to thank the nurses and doctors of the Andrews Memorial Hospital for their loving care and devotion to duty in bringing him safely through his recent severe illness."





Salim Japas, the Austral Union evangelist who has held successful efforts in South America as well as Los Angeles, California, is opening this new series of meetings, and already, according to a survey which is being conducted over 7,000 people have manifested their desire to know the solution to the serious social and moral problems of our day. With God's help we are thankful we can penetrate the great asphalt jungle. It is especially in these large cities where we often find misery, men's hearts

failing them, strikes, and the seeds of revolution. We must meet the needs of these teeming millions with the Advent hope.

Our next task is to penetrate the great interior. With our fleet of launches God has helped us on the Amazon so that in one year, in fact last year, we were able to win some 400 souls with the use of our launches. Our clinics on wheels have helped thousands gain a knowledge of the truth.

For the last four years we have been earnestly studying and developing a new program of using wings for hastening the spread of the gospel and for reaching the

jungle areas in the interior. In the undeveloped areas of South America we are beginning with the use of a small utility airplane. In hundreds of flights which have been undertaken we have found that this can be a safe and secure way of spreading the gospel message more rapidly. The pure air which God has given us has become a freeway to travel in any direction for the reaching of those who sit in the darkness of superstition and the degradation of sin. We are happy to announce that just at this time the General Conference has approved the over-all plan for the establishment of an Ad1. A few months ago a student of the Bible Correspondence School in Sao Paulo, Brazil, decided to keep the Sabbath at all costs. He asked for the Sabbath off, suggesting to his employer that he could make up his time or have the equivalent of the time lost deducted from his salary. To this his employer said,

"If you want to keep the Sabbath, you can go and pick up your salary to date and leave right now. We have no work for people who want

to keep the Sabbath."

He left, to pray and to look for work. It was very difficult to find work. The first day ended and he had found nothing, the second day—nothing. He was sad but not discouraged. At the close of the third day, just after he arrived home, there was a knock on the door. It was his former employer who begged him to return to work immediately. The treasurer of the



business had died and the company was without anyone trustworthy to take his place.

The outcome of this incident was that the Bible Correspondence School student was promoted to the position of treasurer, was granted the Sabbath free, and received a much higher salary than before!

2. A student of the Voice of Prophecy Bible Correspondence School had become completely discouraged. He had no more friends and everything in his life had gone wrong.



This aircraft will be named "Fernando Stahl" in memory of the great pioneer missionary of the highlands and jungles of this region. Well-laid plans are being executed for the construction of a suitable base in Pucallpa, Peru, to serve as headquarters for the pilotmechanic and the plane. From this center, mission outposts in Contamana, Unini, and Nevati are to be served, and new territory entered with the gospel light.
