Purpose of this Study

For years the writer has not been satisfied with the interpretation that Pagan Rome was the restraining power mentioned in these verses. Furthermore, the conviction has been growing that the Holy Spirit, which is Heaven's Representative, is the only power in the world capable of hold-. ing in check the forces of evil. Have we given this third Porson of the God head His rightful place as our Helper against the enemy?

It is the purpose of this brief study:

- (1) To list and clarify the expressions used in the text.
- (2) To learn whether this "man of sin" was "restrained" by Paganian.
- (3) To determine if the "son of perdition" was checked by Pagan Rome.
- (4) To propose and weigh the evidence that "the mystery of iniquity" was held in bounds by Christ and His forces for good.
- (5) To investigate the possibility that the removal of the Holy Spirit from the church resulted in the clothing of the "two witnesses in sackcloth". (Rev. 11)

In order to have the verses involved clearly in mind, a number of translations of II Thess. 2:6-8 are here presented.

SIGNIFICANT EXPRESSIONS

"Falling Away" - v. 3

This no doubt was the great apostacy which Paul saw beginning in his day, and the method of approach was to gain control of the minds of men and thus gradually usurp the place of God in the soul temple.

"Even at that <u>early date</u> he saw, creeping into the church, errors that would prepare the way for the development of the papacy. <u>Little by little</u>, at first in stealth and silence, and then more openly as it increased in strength and gained control of the minds of man, the mystery of iniquity carried forward its deceptive and blasphenous work. " <u>(G.C. 49)</u>

The attempt of Satan to take over the tomple of God as his throne which was "little by little, at first in stealth and silence, and then more openly as it increased in strength," has been continuous to the present time. Just to the extent that he succeeded did corruption enter the church and apostacy result. He will make his greatest attack and gain his greatest success just before the second coming of Christ.

"The kingdom of darkness shall continue until the advent of the Lord, and shall be consumed with the spirit of His mouth, and be destroyed with the brightness of His coming." (G.C. 321)

"The <u>Protostants</u> of the United States will be foremost in stretching their hands across the gulf to grasp the hand of <u>Spiritualism</u>; they will reach over the abyss to clasp hands with the <u>Roman power</u>; and under the influence of this threefold union, this country will **in follow** in the steps of Rome in trampling on the rights of conscience." (G.C. 588)

"Yet under one head, - the papel power, - the people will unite to oppose God in the person of His witnessos." (T. VII, 182)

"The restraint which has been upon the wicked is removed, and Satan has entire control of the finally impenitont. God's long-suffering has ended. The world has rejected His nercy, despised His love, and trampled upon His law. guthor of the paper, or Elder R, F, Cottrell.

The wicked have passed the boundary of their probation; the Spirit of God, porsistently resisted, has been at last withdrawn. <u>Unsheltered by divine grace</u>, they have no protection from the wicked one. Satas will then plunge the inhabitants of the earth into one great, final trouble. As the angels of God cease to hold in check the fierce winds of human passion, all the elements of strife will be let loose. The whole world will be involved in ruin more terrible than that which came upon Jerusaler of eld."

"As the <u>crowning act</u> in the great drama of deception, <u>Satan himself will personate Christ</u>. The church has long professed to look to the Saviour's advent as the consummation of her hopes. Now the great deceiver will make it appear that Christ has come. In different parts of the earth, Satan will manifest himself among men as a majestic being of dazzling brightness, resembling the description of the Son of God given by John in the Revelation." (G.C. 624)

"Hystery of Iniquity", "Son of Pordition", "That Hicked",

"lian of Sin" - v. 3, 7-8

All of these expressions apply primarily to Satan and se-

condarily to the papacy.

Satan himself abode not in the Truth; he is the mystery of iniquity." (T.M. 365)

"The "man of sin," which is also styled the 'mystery of iniquity," the 'son of perdition, ' and ' that wicked," represents the papacy, which as foretold in prophecy, Was to maintain its supremacy for 1260 years." (G.C. 356)

"He who now Lettoth" v. 7

"He who now holdeth" (Douay), "One that restraineth now" (A. R. C.), "The man who now restrains it" (Neymouth), "He who at present restrains it" (Noffatt), "He who now restrains it" (R.S.V.), "He who is now holding it in check" (An Am. Trans.).

The Greek word for "letteth" (Katecho) means "to hold down", and is the same word translated in verse <u>6</u> "withholdoth". These are the only times it is so translated of the 19 usages in the Bible. However, in v. 6 it is neuter gender while in V.7 it is masculine. (This is true also when the Holy Spirit is referred to in John 14 & 15) The pronoun "He", in both instances, refers to the same force which is something other than the "mystery of iniquity," and "that wicked".

"THAT THICH RESTRAINETH" - v. 6-7 (A.R. C.)

WAS the "Man of sin" "restrained" by Paraniam?

Paganism came into the church when Christianity lost its simplicity and lowered its standards during the "latter end of the second century."

"That was the origin of the great apostasy? How did the church first depart from the simplicity of the gospel? By conforming to the practices of paganian, to facilitate the accoptance of Christianity by the heathen. The apostle Paul declared, even in his day, "The mystery of iniquity doth already work." During the lives of the apostles the church remained comparatively pure. But "towerd the latter end of the second contury most of the churches assured a a new form; the first simplicity disappeared, and insensibly, as the old disciples retired to their graves, their Ghildren, along with new converts, ... cano forward and new-modeled the cause." To secure converts, the exalted standard of the Christian faith was lowered, and as the result a pagan flood, flowing into the church, carried with it its customs, practices, and idols. As the Christian religion secured the favor and support of secular rulers, it was noninally accepted by multitudes; but while in appearance Christians, many remained in substance pagans, especially worshipping in secret their idols." (G.C. 384,385)

The result of this union of Paganian with Christianity was the Papacy, and instead of the "Hystery of iniquity" being "restrained" by Paganian it with Christianity, produced the papacy. Furthermore, while Paganian gave way before the rise of the Papacy, it actually conquered "Christianity", and this was largely accomplished by the ond of the second century.

"Then the early church become corrupted by <u>departing</u> from the <u>simplicity of the gospel</u> and accepting <u>heathen rites</u> and <u>customs</u> she lost the Spirit and power of God; and in order to control the consciences of the people, she sought the <u>support of the socular power</u>. The result was the papacy, a church that controlled the power of the state, and employed it to further her own ends, especially for the punishment of "heresy." (G.C. 443) "Little by little, at first in stealth and silence, and then more openly as it increased in strength and gained control of the minds of men, the mystery of iniquity carried forward its deceptive and blasphenous work. Almost imperceptibly the customs of heatherism found their way into the Christian church. (G.C. 49)

"Paganian had given place to the papacy. The dragon had given to the beast his power, and his seat, and great authority". And not began the 1260 years of papal oppression foretold in the prophecies of Caniel and the Covelation. (GiC. 54)

"Now the work of corruption rapidly progressed. <u>Paranian</u>, while appearing to be vanquished, <u>became the conqueror</u>. Her spirit controlled the church. Her doctrines, ceremonies, and superstitions were incorporated into the faith and worship of the professed followers of Christ. "This compromise between paganism and Christianity resulted in the <u>development of the 'man of sin</u>' forefold in prophecy as op-

posing and exclting himself above God. That digantic system of false religion is a masterpiece of Satan's power, a monument of his efforts to seat himself upon the threne to rule the earth according to his will." (G.C. 50)

Conclusion

Was the Son of Perdition" "restrained" by Pagan Rome?

Was the kingdom of Satan divided with one force working against the other? Dil Satan not work through both Pagan Rome and the Papacy? Why then, woull be use Pagan Rome, through which he was working, to "restrain" the mise of another power- the papacy - through which he planned to work far <u>more effectively</u>? Was Satan unable to control his forces so that he could not call off the forces of Pagan Rome in order to bring on the Papacy which is the "Thaterpiece of his power?" (G.C.50) Wasn't this "a buse divided a cinet itself" and thus doened to failure? Isn't Saten too smart for that? Even though on the surface there seems to be at times divisions among the forces of Satan, his purpose - destruction of both bad and good - is never divided or subordinated. Take the French Revolution, for instance. As long as Satan's ultimate plan - destruction of all was fulfilled it made no difference to him who killed when! They were just as dead one way as another and thus in his clutches.

"The willing subjects of Satan are faithful, active, and united in one object. And although they have and war with one another, yet they improve every opportunity to advance their common intorest. But the great Commander in Heaven and earth has limited Satan's power," (Vol. 1:346)

Did Pagan Rome "restrain" the rise of the Papacy? The only statements which even hint at it are found in the following quotations:

"The <u>spirit of compromise</u> and conformity was <u>restrained</u> for a time by the fierce persecutions which the church endured under paganism. But as persecution ceased, and Christianity entered the courts and palaces of kings, she laid aside the humble simplicity of Christ and His apostles for the pomp and pride of pagan priosts and rulers; and in place of the requirements of God, she substituted human theories and traditions." (G.C. 49)

"Thus, as long as persecution continued, the church remained <u>comparatively pure</u>. But as it ceased, converts were added who were less sincere and devoted, and the way was opened for Satan to obtain a foothold." (G.C. 44)

But this second letter of Paul to the Thossalonians was written, according to the best authorities, about 51-2 A.D. The Greek word "arti", v. 7, ("Now", "just now", "this noment", opposite of future) is in the present tense indicating the "restraining power" was at work at that very time (51 A.D.), and not to be in some time in the future. In fact, during the first one-hundred years the Christians suffered more at the hands of the Jews than of Rome. Only two minor persecutions broke during this period, these under Here and Domitian, and in each case it was only a local outburst caused by a whim or caprice of the emperor, and not to especially attack the Christians. The Christians had no separate identity until after 100 A.D. being classed as a sect of the Jeus proviously. Nero's persecution in64 A.D. was at least ten years after the statement in Thessalenians was written, and Domitian's at least. Forty years after. In noither case were more than a few hundred victime killed.

Furthermore, during the next century, up to about 250 A.D., there was no studied plan on the part of Roman Government to obliterate Christianity. If one was accused of being a Christian, the accuser had to sign the statement and appear at the trial if called. It was a police power measure and only when mob psychology developed in the local provinces did persocutions break out on a large scale. After 250 A.D., one finds the leaders of the Roman Government deliberately planning empire-wide annihilation, but that was two-hundred years after Paul's statement was written.

Conclusion

The fact that Faul's statement given years before Rome ever persecured the Christians, and at that time the "restraining" power was already functioning, would eliminate Pagan Rome as the "restraining power" on the point of chronology.

Then, when one remembers, that all of the major errors found in this "man of sin" were already in the "Christian" church, or were smiled upon by the majority of **M**is members before the time of Constantine's edicts of toleration and Sunday, and his "conversion", it appears that Pagan Rome had not been removed **Before** "that wicked" had become very prominent in the Roman Impire.

The only way in which persecution could "restrain" the rise of the "man of sin" was due to the fact that persecution always purifies the church of God and tends to keep it pure. This purity retained the reign of the Holy Spirit in the soul-temple and in the church-temple.

Again, if Pagan Rome was the power which "restrained" the rise of the Papacy, why then should prophecy (Rev. 13:2) speak of the dragon (Pagan Rome) giving to the Papacy "his power, and his seat, and great authority"? This sounds more like full cooperation rather than conflict. Is it logical to think that a power which had opposed and fought against another power for hundreds of years would later bestew upon that power all his position and strength, and do it with willingness?

Then, too, it is difficult for the writer to see any serious division in Satan's ranks, esp cially when two major agencies of his are involved. It is agreed there are minor conflicts among Satan's forces, but if the Bible and the Spirit of Prophecy teach anything on this point, it is that there has been displayed the greatest of unity and cooperation, in Satan's sole objective - that of destroying both bad and good.

Was the "Mystery of Iniquity" "restrained" by the Agency of the Holy Spirit?

The Holy Spirit and Its temple

It is true that God alone can restrain Satan in his efforts to set up his throno in the tomple of the soul as well as in the church, "because greater is he that is in you, then he that is in the world" (I John 4:4). This was no doubt speaking of the Spirit of God-the Holy spirit - (v. 2) which had been diven to dwell within the heart of each true follower of Christ (John 14:17,20). The soul-temple must bedefiled first before the church-temple can be.

"Know ye not that ye are the temple of God, and that the Spirit of God dwelloth in you? If any man defile the temple of God, him BMAIL GOD destroy; for the temple of God is hely, which temple ye are. (I Cor. 3:16, 17)

"And what agreement hath the temple of God with idels? for ye are the temple of the living God; as God hath said, I will <u>dwell in</u> than, and walk in them; and I will be their God, and they shall

be my people." (I Cor. 6:16)

Satan is powerloss to drive the Holy Spirit from this soul-temple and as long as the Christian chooses Gol to rule in his life Satan -"Lystery of iniquity" - is "restrained". The Holy Spirit is driven out - "taken out of the way" - only by the choice of the individual

hinself.

"The Lord Jesus is making experiments on human hearts through the exhibition of His mercy and abundant grace. He is effecting transformations so amazing that Satan, with all his triumphant beasting, with all his confederacy of evil united against God and the laws of His government, stands viewing them as a <u>fortress imprograble</u> to his sophistries and delusions. They are to him an <u>incompre-</u> honsible mystory," (T.M. 18)

"Then <u>Christ</u> took human nature upon Him, He bound humanityto himself by a tie of love that can nover be broken by any power save the choice of man himself. Satan will constantly present alluraments to induce us to break this tie, -to choose to separate ourselves from Christ. Here is where we need to watch, to strive, to pray, that nothing may entice us to choose another master; for we are always free to do this." (S. C. 70)

Satan was trying in Paul's day to onthrone himself in the soultemple of each child of God for "where <u>God's throne should have been</u>, <u>Satan had placed his throne</u>", but Jesus said,: "<u>There Satan has set</u> <u>his throne, there shall I stand my cross</u>. Sutan shall be east out, and I will be lifted up to draw all men unto me!" (6T. 236,237) Satan has continued persistently to try to break through and drive the Holy Spirit from the throne of the soul-temple.

"Satan is trying to set up his throng in the soul-temple. Then he reigns, he makes himself heard and felt in angry passions, in words of bitterness that grieve and wound; but as light has no communion with darkness, and Christ no union with Belial, the man must be wholly for one or the other." (4T. 346)

"If we do not co-oporate with the heavenly agencies, Satan will take possession of the heart, and will make it his abiding place. The only defense against evil is the induelling of Christ in the heart through faith in His righteousness." (D.A. 324)

In a larger sense the tonple of God is the church-temple but whether the soul-temple or the church-temple, man's only restraining power against

Satan is God's representative on earth - the Holy Spirit.

"The long-suffering of God toward Jerusalan only confirmed the Jews in their stubborn imponitance. In their hatrod and cruelty toward the disciples of Jesus, they rejected the last offer of mercy. Then <u>God Withdrew His protection</u> from them, and <u>removed</u> <u>His restraining power from Satan and his angols</u>, and the nation was loft to the control of the leader she had chosen." (<u>G.C. 28</u>)

"Satan works through the elements also to garner his harvest of unprepared souls. He has studied the secrets of the laboratories of nature, and he uses all his power to control the elements as far as God allows. Then he was suffered to afflict Job, how quickly flocks and herds, servants, houses, children, were swept away, one trouble succeeding another as in a moment. It is God that shields his creatures, and hedges then in from the power of the destroyer. (G.C. 589)

"And the Lord will do just what He has declared that He would, --He will withdraw His bledsings from the earth, and remove His protecting care from these who are rebelling against His law, and teaching and forcing others to do the same. Satan has control of all whom God does not especially guard." (G.C. 589)

"The wicked have passed the boundary of their probation; the Spirit of God, persistently resisted, has been at last withdrawn. Unsheltered by divine grace, they have no protection from the wicked one. Satan will then plunge the inhabitants of the earth into one great final trouble. As the angols of God cease to hold in check the fierce winds of human passion, all the elements of strife will be let loose. The whole world will be involved in ruin more torrible than that which came upon Jerusalem of old. -- A Single angel destroyed all the "irst-born of the Egyptians, and filled the land with mourning. When David offended against God by numbering the people, one angel caused that terrible destruction by which his sin was punished. The same destructive power exercised by hely angels when God commands, will be exercised by evil angels when he permits. There are forces now ready, and only waiting the divine permission, to spread desolation everywhere. " (G.C. 614)

"While Jesus had been standing between God and guilty man, a <u>re-</u> straint was upon the poople; but when He stopped out from between man and the Father, the restraint was removed, and Satan had entire control of the finally imperitent." (<u>E.U. 280</u>)

"But Jehovah has set Satan's bounds, --<u>restrained his power</u>, -and not all the energy's devices can convey one spark to Baal's altar." (P.E. 150)

"God alone can limit the power of Satan." (Vol. 1:341)

"Nevertheless I tell you the truth; It is expedient for you that I Go away: for if I go not away, the Conferter will not come unto you; but if I depart, I will send Him unto you. Evil had been accumulating for centuries, and <u>could only be restrained</u> and <u>resisted</u> by the <u>mighty power</u> of the <u>Holy Spirit</u>, the third person of the Godhead, who would come with no modified energy, but in the fullness of divine power. Another spirit must be met; for the essence of evil was working in all ways, and the submission of man to this satenic captivity was amazing." (<u>T.M. 392</u>)

<u>Methods used by Satan in establishing the "Man of sin"</u> The first nothed used was persecution in an attempt to obliterate

Obristianity but that failed, and it failed because persecution always

tonds to purify the soul-temple where the Holy Spirit roigns.

"Paganism foresaw that should the gospel triumph, her temples and altars would be swept away; therefore she surmoned her forces to <u>destroy Christianity</u>. The fires of persecution were kindled. Christians were stripped of their possessions, and driven from their homes." (G.C. 39)

"In vain were Satan's efforts to destroy the church of Christ by Violence. The great controversy in which the disciples of Jesus yielded up their lives, did not cease when these faithful standardbearers fell at their post. By defeat they conquered. God's workmen were slain, but <u>His work went stoadily forward</u>. The gospel . continued to spread, and the number of its adherents to increase." (G.C. 41)

Failing in the use of force, which kept the temple pure, Satan next used his most effective weapon <u>temporal prosperity and Worldly honor</u> and he succeeded in deceiving the church members into a compromise. Thus the soul-temple was defiled and the Holy Spirit was "taken out of the way", at least in the majority of cases.

"Satan therefore <u>laid his plans to war more successfully</u> against the government of God, by planting his banner in the Christian church. If the followors of Christ would be deceived, and <u>led</u> to <u>displease God</u>, then their strength, fortitude, and firmness would fail, and they would fall an easy prey." (G.C. 42)

"The great adversary not endeavored to gain by artifice that he had failed to secure by force. <u>Persecution ceased</u>, and in its stead were substituted the <u>dangerous allurements</u> of <u>temporal pros</u>perity and <u>worldly honor</u>. Idelaters were led to receive a part of the Christian faith, while they rejected other essential truths. They professed to accept Jesus as the Son of God, and to believe in His death and resurrection; but they had no conviction of sin, and felt no need of ropentance or of a change of heart. With some concessions on their part, they proposed that Christians should make concessions, that all night unite on the platform of belief in Christ.

"Now the church was in <u>fearful peril</u>. Prison, torture, fire, and sword were blessings in comparison with this. Some of the Christians stood firm, declaring that they could make no compresse. Others were in <u>favor</u> of yielding or modifying some features of their faith, and uniting with those who had accopted a part of Christianity, unging that this might be the means of their full conversion. That was a time of deep anguish to the faithful followers of Christ. Under a cloak of pretended Christianity, <u>Saten</u> was insinuating himself into the church, to corrupt their faith, and turn their minds from the word of truth.

"Host of the Christians at last conserved to lower their standard and a union was formed between Christianity and paganism. Although the worshippers of idols professed to be converted, and united with the church, they still clung to their idolatry, only changing the objects of their worship to images of Jesus, and even of Mary and the saints. The foul leaven of idolatry, thus brought into the church continued its baleful work. Unsound doctrines, superstitious rites, and idolatrous ceremonics were incorporated into hor faith and worship." (G.C. 42, 43)

"This compromise between paganism and Christianity resulted in the development of the "man of sin" foretold in prophocy as opposing and exalting himself above God. That gigantic system of false religion is a masterpicce of Satan's power, -- a monument of his efforts to seat himself upon the threne to rule the earth according to his will." (G.C. 50)

The Holy Spirit, on the throne of the scul-temple of each Christian,

was the personification of all the powers of Heaven sent to "restrain"

the "mystery of iniquity", and check its rise.

"If ye love me, keep my commandments. And I will pray the Father, and he shall (ive you another Conforter, that he may abide with you for ever; Even the Spirit of truth; when the world cannot receive, because it seeth him not, neither knoweth him: for he dwelleth with you, and shall be in you. (John 14:20, 21)

"The gift of His Holy Spirit, rich full, and abundant, is to be to His church as an <u>encompassing</u> wall of fire, which the <u>powers</u> of hell shall <u>not</u> prevail against." (T. <u>1</u>, <u>18</u>)

"What are these, in contrast with the errors of that day when the restraining Spirit of God shall be wholly withdrawn from the wicked, no longer to hold in check the outburst of human passion and satanic wrath." The world will then behold, as never before, the results of Satan's rule." (G.C. 37)

Could the "taking away of that which Rostrainoth" have resulted in the "taking away of the Daily"?

With the influx of corruption into the temple of God, which restricted the work of the Holy Spirit in the church, the power of the Papacy increased. Oradually taking more and more power to himself he finally usurped not only the place of the Holy Spirit but that of Christ as well.

"The accession of the Roman Church to power marked the beginning of the Dark Ages. As her power increased, the darkness deepened. <u>Faith was transferred from Christ</u>, the true foundation, to the Pope of Rome. Instead of trusting in the Son of God for forgiveness of sins and for eternal salvation, the people looked to the pope, and to the priests and prelates to when he delegated authority. They were taught that the pope was their <u>earthly media-</u> tor, and that none could approach God except through him; and further, that he stood in the place of God to them, and was therefore to be implicity obeyed. A deviation from his requirements was sufficient cause for the severest punishment to be visited upon the bodies and souls of the offenders. Thus the minds of the people were turned away from God to fallible, erring, and eruel men, may, more, to the prince of darkness hinself, who exercised his power through them." (G.C.55)

"Thus the pope cane to be almost universally acknowledged as the vicegerent of God on earth, endowed with authority over Church and state.". (G.C. 51)

Then, with the removal of the restraining power, -the Holy Spiritfrom the church, the "man of sin" soon substituted the mass for the "one sacrifice" made by Christ, and for the mediation of Christ was substituted confession to a<u>human priest</u> who claimed to <u>forgive sins</u>, and <u>prayers to Virgin Nary</u> as man's mediator with God.

Thus the "restraining" force, to all intents and purposes, was taken away from the minds and hearts of the great majority of the people in the same sense as the "daily" was "taken away", and the law of God was "changed".

War upon the Two Witnessos

Further, with the "taking away" of this rostraining forces the Holy Spirit - There resulted the "Dark Ages" during which time the فيدينه درق

"Two Witnosses prophesied in sackcloth" (Rev. 11:3-6). Primarily these

two witnessos were the Living Witnessess - Christ and the Holy Spirit.

"And from Jesus Christ, who is the faithful witness, and the first begotten of the dead, and the prince of the kings of the earth. Unto him that loved us, and wahed us from our sins in his own blood." (Rev. 1:15)

"The <u>Holy Spirit</u> comes to the world as Christ's representative. It not only speaks the truth, but it is the truth — the <u>faithful</u> and true <u>Witness</u>. It is the great Searcher of hearts, and is acquainted with the characters of all." (<u>O.T. 68</u>).

And secondarily, they were the Old and Now Testaments which were

obscured by the laity not being permitted to read then, by their scarcity, by their being kept in the Latin Language, and by a cloud of pagan superstitions which surrounded then.

"Concerning the two witnesses, the prophet doclares further, "These are the two clive-trees, and the two candlesticks standing before the God of the earth." "Thy word," said the psalmist, "is a lamp unto my feet, and a light unto my path." (Rev. 11:4; Ps. 119:105) The Two Witnesses represent the <u>Scriptures</u> of the <u>Old</u> and <u>New</u> <u>Testament</u>. Both are important testimonies to the origin and perpetuity of the law of God. Both are witnesses also of the plan of salvation. The types, sacrifices, and prophecies of the Old Testament point forward to a Savieur to come. The Gospels and Epistles of the New Testament tell of a Savieur who has come in the exact manner foretold by type and prophecy." (G.C. 267)

In order for Saten to maintain his sway over men, and establish the authority of the papal usurger, he must keep them in informance of the <u>Scriptures</u>. The Bible would exalt God, and place finite men in their true position; therefore its sacred truths must be concealed and suppressed. This logic was adopted by the Roman Church. For hundreds of years the circulation of the Bible was prohibited. The people were forbidden to read it or have it in their houses, and unprincipled priests and prelates interpreted its teachings to sustain their protonsions. Thus the pope came to be almost universally acknowledged as the vicegerent of God on earth, endewed with authority over Church and state..... The detector of error having been removed, Satan worked according to his will." (G.C. 51)

The climax of this stack cane during the French Revolution when for three and one-half years these "witnesses" were barred from France (See G.C. 265-288). This up surge of power on the part of Satan, "the beast of the bottomless pit", was due to the removal of God's" retraining" force - the Holy Spirit.

"The restraining SpiritofGod, which imposes a check upon the cruel power of Satan, was in a great measure removed, and he whose only delight is the wretchedness of men, was permitted to work his will." (G.C.286)

As the Spirit of God - "That which restrainsth" - has continued to be removed through apostacy the power of the "mystery of iniquidy" has increased down to our day. The Holy Spirit will be gradually withdrawn from the earth until at the <u>close of probation</u> Satan will have full control of the inhabitants of the earth save the small group who are sealed by God and kept by the Holy Spirit during the time of trouble.

"The <u>Spirit of God is gradually</u> but suroly being <u>withdrawn from</u> the earth. Plagues and judgments are already falling upon the despisors of the grace of God. The calamities by land and sea, the unsettled state of society, the alarms of war, are portentous. They forecast approaching events of the greatest magnitude. The <u>Agencies of cvil</u> are <u>combining</u> their forces, and consolidating. They are strong thening for the last great crisis. Great changes are soon to take place in our world, and the final movements will be rapid ones. <u>(97.11)</u>

"The restraint which has been upon the whicked is removed, and Satan has entire control of the finally imponitont. God's longsuffering has ended. The world has rejected His morey, despised His love, and trampled upon His law. The wicked have passed the boundary of their probation; the spirit of God, persistently resisted, has been at last withdrawn. Unsheltered by divine (race, they have no protection from the wicked one. Saten will then plunge the inhabitants of the earth into one great, final trouble. As the angels of God cease to hold in check the fierce winds of human passion, all the elements of strife will be it loose. The whole world will be involved in ruin more terrible than that which came upon Jerusalom of old. (G.C. 614)

Conclusion

If persecution or the use of force, kept the church comparatively pure and thus Pagan Rome was able to "restrain" the rise of the Papacy (G.C. 49), as many hold, then why did the Devil think his first tactics the use of force - had failed (G.C. 42)? If Satan through Pagan Rome was to check the rise of the "nam of sin", thy did he not continue the use of force which had proved so successful in keeping the church pure and thereby delaying the appearance of this "man of sin"? And, if the use of force by Pagan Rome fulfilled II Thess. 2:6-8, then why did the Devil feel that he had failed and change his plan of attack? Uhy did he cease the use of force (G.C. 42-43) and substitute for it temporal prosperity, ease, and Worldly honor, which brought about the "man of sin", if he (Papacy) was the one Pagan Rome was fighting hard to held down? The vory heart of the arguments supporting Pagan Rome as the "restraining power" is unsound and valueless when force is replaced by case and prosperity for them. Pagan Rome no longer "restrained" the rise of the "mystery of iniquity", but rather worked for him hand-in-glove, and, keep in mind the fact, that the power (Pagan Rome) which used force to "restrain" the "man of sin" was the seme one (Pagan Rome) that used prosperity and compromise to pave the way for his rise to power.

If the taking away of the "Daily" was not the removal of Paganism or of Pagan Rome, but of Christ in His mediatorial work for man in the beavenly sanctuary and substituting for it a human system of mediation set up by the "man of sin", thus counterfeiting God's agencies for His Flan of Salvation, and, if the clothing of the "two witnesses in sackcloth" was the taking away or obscuring of the position and work of Christ and the Holy Spirit as p esented in the Old and New Testaments, and this work too was accomplished by the same "man of sin" and during the same period of time, is it not logical to conclude that this "restraining" power to the Dovil in setting up his counterfeit mediatorial system thus obscuring the work of the "two witnesses", was God and His Holy Spirit in the earth?

Some hold that if Paul had meant the Holy Spirit as the "restraining" power, he would have said so in just so many words. 18.

That is not necessarily true. A truth or fact night be so well established that it need not to be repeated. In all of Paul's writing he emphasized the Hely Spirit and its work above any other one subject save that of Christ and Him Crudified, and no doubt he had taught the Thessalonians so theroughly on that point that he needed only to say "remember <u>ye</u>" not, that, when I was with you, I told you these things? And <u>new ye know</u> What withheldeth that he might be revealed in his time" (v. 5-6).

This is an argument from silence, and if one disregards it if this connection he must disregard it also concerning the Seventh-day Sabbath, for there is no specific command in all the New Testament that Christ's followers wore to observe that day, while each of the other nine commandments is so stated.

Furthermore, is it logical to conclude, that when the church compromised and failed God that the "restraining" power which Heaven had placed in the world to counteract the Devil and his force ("mystery of iniquity"), was "taken out of the way" in the same sense as the ministration of Christ was "taken away" and God's law was "changed"?

Finally, it seems clear in view of references quoted in the body of this study (especially G.C. 614; E.W. 280; T. M. 392 that there is no other power in the universe that can "restrain" Satan and his activities in this world than that of God Working through His Holy Spirit in the world. Since the "man of sin" was and is an agency of the Devil, it follows, that none but God through the Holy Spirit could have placed a oheck upon him, and, therefore, must have been "that which re19.

straineth".

May I ask a few Questions?

Is it true: That the "man of sin" was to arise in the ohurch?

Is it true: That if the church of God had remained pure, the "man of sin" could never have arisen and II These. 2:6-8 would never have been prophosied?

Is it true: That it was only as the church lost sight of Christ and removed the Holy Spirit - His Representative - by choosing another master - the "mystery of iniquity" - that the "man of sin" could and did arise?

The Writer therefore concludes : That the purity of the church which permitted the Holy Spirit to reign in the soultemple was the sole restraint to the "man of sin" who was to arise in the church, and not Pagan Rame which was <u>outside</u> the church. As the church gradually apostatized, the "man of sin" gained in power until <u>he</u> hold a dominate position in the churchtemple. There was a spiritual warfare - <u>Eph. 6:10-17</u> - <u>within the church</u> and not against Pagan Rome. The purity of the church could be maintained only as the members were controlled by the Holy Spirit, which Spirit then restrained the rise of the "man of sin". As the Holy Spirit was grieved away through the apostacy of the members of the church "that which restraineth" was "taken out of the way", and "that wicked" - the Papacy was revealed which Christ will "consume with the spirit of His mouth and destroy with the brightness of His coming." Furthermore, Eph. 6:10-17 and T. N. 392 shows the church's warfare was not against flesh and blood (Pagan Rome) but with evil spirits with Satan as their leader. The only way to meet these spiritual forces was to the Spiritual Holpor - the Holy Spirit. "Take the <u>Spirit as your sword" (Moffatt</u>) and this power was in the church when Haul wrote II Thess. 2. When this weapon was removed through apostacy, the restraint on the "man of sin" was removed also, and he arose. Likewise, the armour was to be used against evil spirits (v. 13), and not against Pagan Rome. The real foo, then as now was the Holy Spirit. (T.E. 392)
