Weekend to Honor College Graduates

Alumni and Faculty Entertain Seniors At Annual Banquet

Because of inclement weather, the annual reception given by the Alumni Association for the graduates of 1956 was held in the College cafeteria on Tuesday evening, August 21, from 6:30 to 9:30. Original plans called for a lawn party at Dean Sandborn's home.

Mrs. Lucille Hilgers and those who worked with her had prepared gift booklets for the graduates and other items which helped to make the reception a success. Mrs. Helen Sandborn and Mrs. Gilbert Johnson were in charge of the food committee. There was an abundance of food for first and second helpings and even thirds.

The program committee, of which Mrs. James D. Simmons was chairman, provided music by Mrs. Edwina Williams, a lovely soprano from Riverside Sanitarium and Hospital, where she is taking the L.P.N. course, and violin numbers by Mrs. Dorothy Moon. 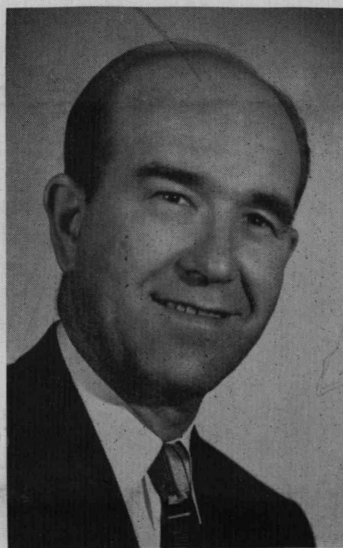

President to Award Eighty-eight Honors

Eighty-eight degrees, diplomas, and certificates will be presented to those completing twelve courses of study, at the annual commencement of Madison College to be held on Saturday night, September 1, in the Helen Funk Assembly Hall.

The B.S. degree will be given to thirty-two, nurses' diplomas to twenty-five, X-ray certificates to one, medical technology certificates to seven, elementary teacher-training certificates to six, medical record certificates to six, physical therapy certificates to one and anesthesiology diplomas to ten.

Graduation weekend begins on Friday night with the consecration service. This is followed by the baccalaureate sermon on Sabbath morning. The climax of the weekend comes on Saturday night with the commencement address and the awarding of the degrees and diplomas.

Consecration

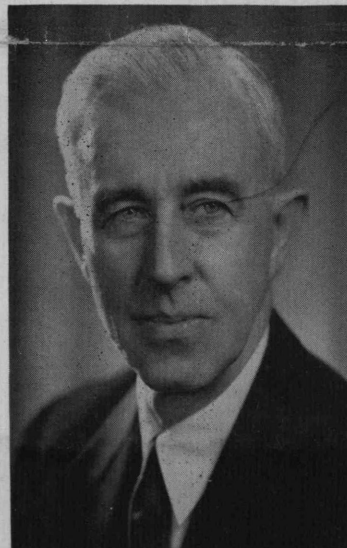

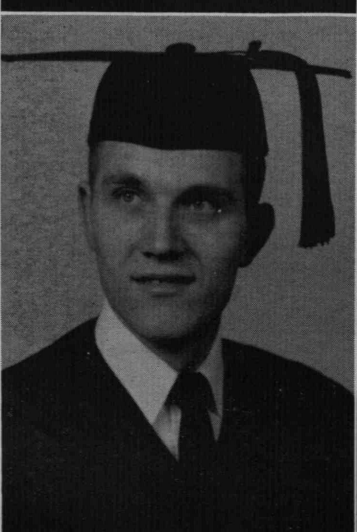
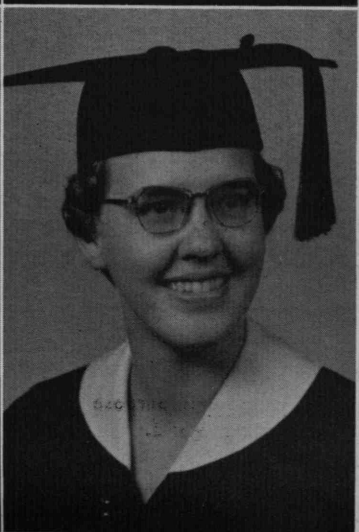
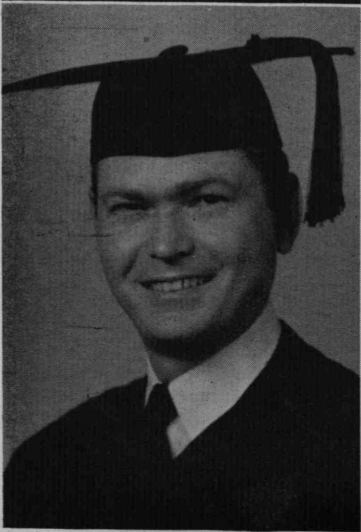
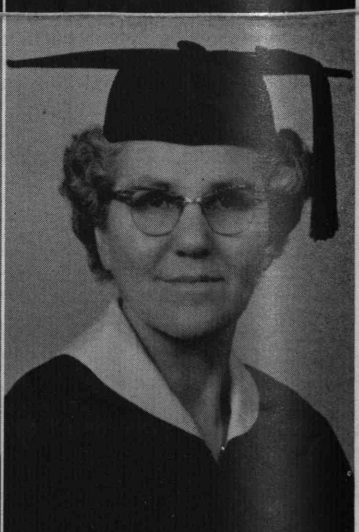
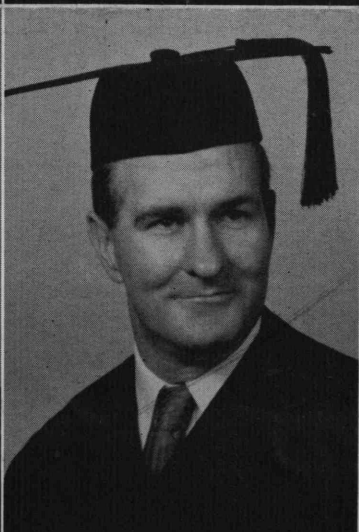
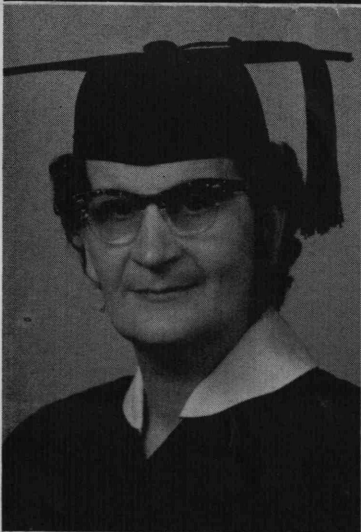
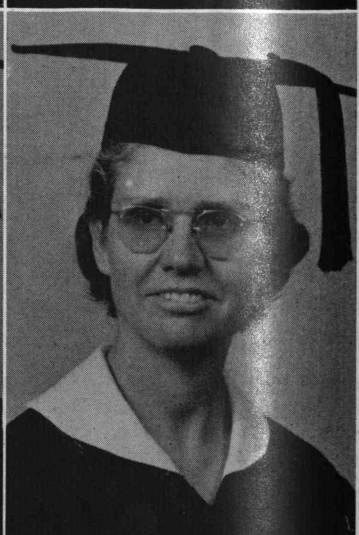
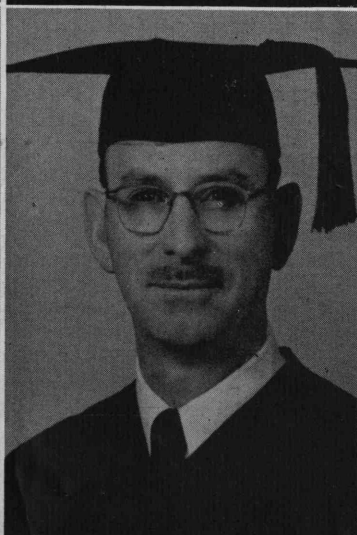
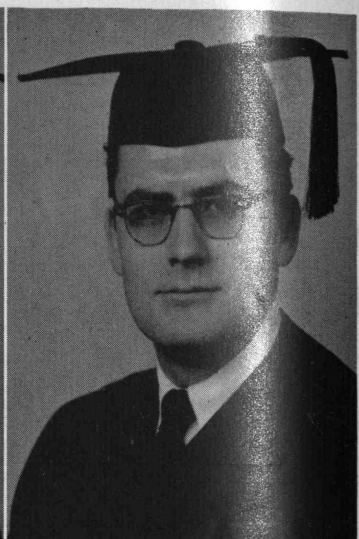
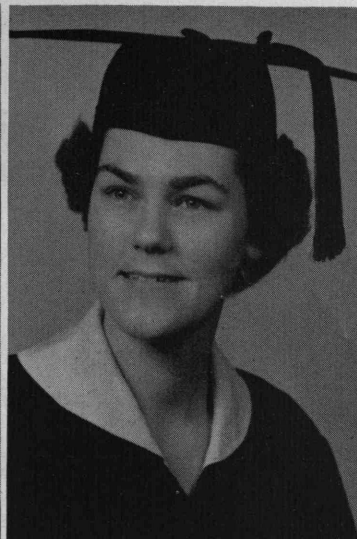
Commencement

Special music for the program will be provided by the class sponsor, Felix Lorenz, Jr.

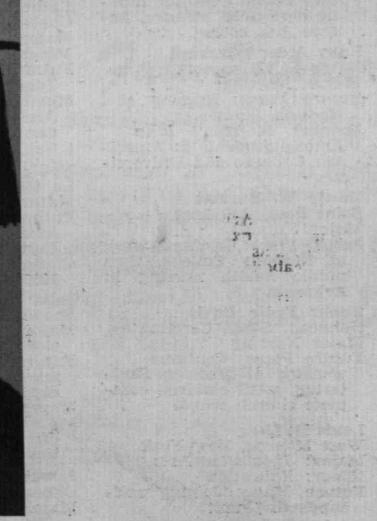
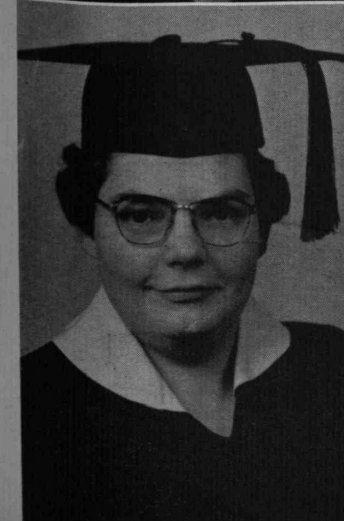
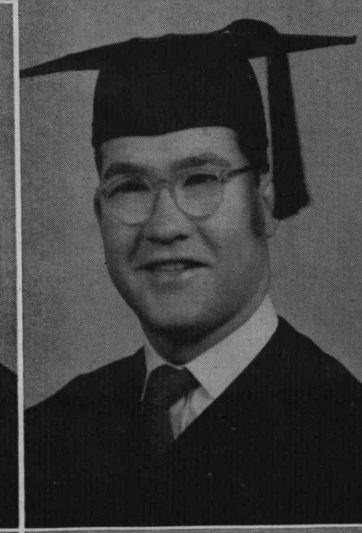
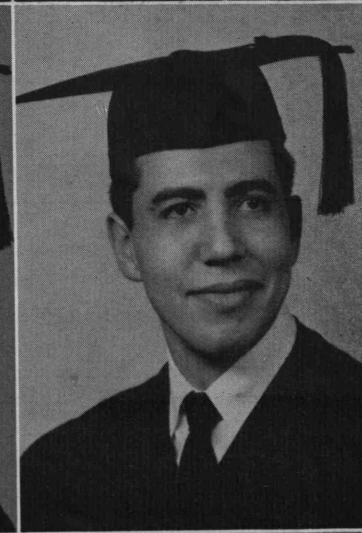
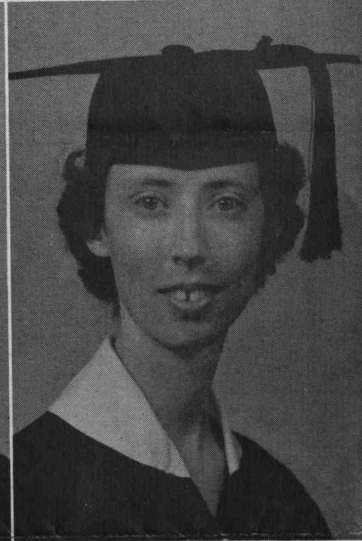
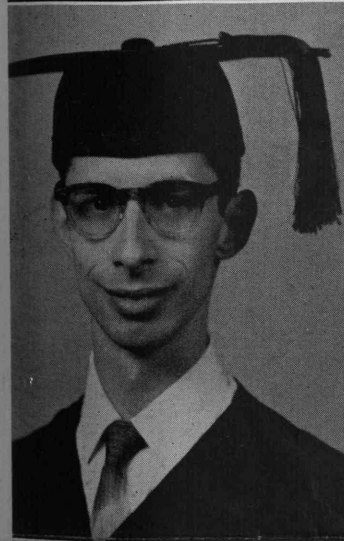
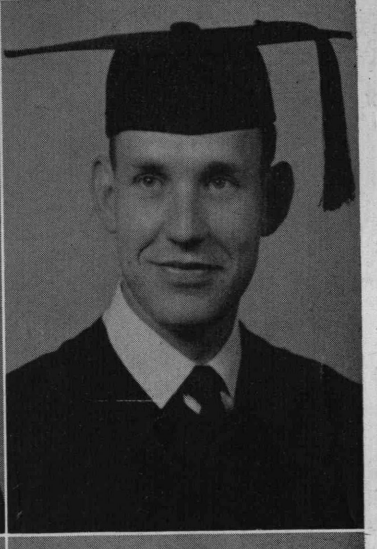
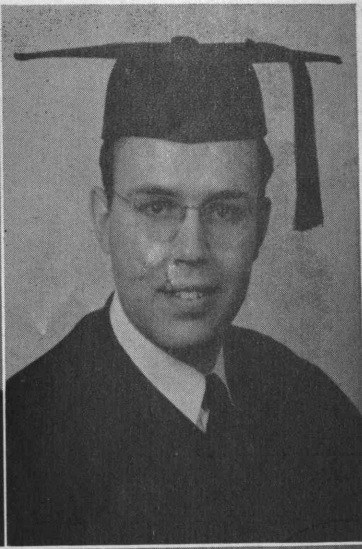
