THINGS IN THE BIBLE THAT MEAN THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA

(Ezk. 30, 31 and 32). By John S. Stanford In the above chapters the United States of Am-erica are plainly pointed out. (Ezk. 30, 31 and 32 and some other books.) Now do not get scared out, nor offended, nor disgusted, and lay down this paper and

run off. But, instead, let us, give it a study and see. In the first place, you and I know that, according to Rom. 15:4, and 1 Cor. 10-11, the Old Testament was written for our day, (1928 and onward.) That the things, whatever of them did happen, happened unto them for a sample of what is going to take place down here with us, upon whom the ends of the world are come," 1 Cor. 10:11. The Bible says this, so now let us believe it and go ahead with our study.

Then, whether you have had your attention already called to it or not, even tho the names given are ancient names and modern names are withheld, yet we may know whom and which of us is meant by location, condition, characteristics, and doings. If those traits and circumstances and conditions that existed in those ancient nations, which are named, exist in us, today, we are the ones meant, and those ancient names are, in God's sight, OUR NAMES today

So let us not dodge, but be honest and fair-minded in the matter, and if we wish to avoid, whatever consequences are going to be bitter, let us repent of our sins, and (according to Ezk. 33:14-19), get right

with God and live, which is our kindly privilege, and in fact, our only hope. So come on, I am going to study this out and invite you to do the same with me. In Ezekiel 27th and 28th chapters "Tyrus" (in the King James Version and "Tyre" in the Douay version) stands for England. The "Prince of Tyrus" (28th Chap.) stands for Satan, but the human doings and abaracteristics in the 27th abarter are the works and characteristics in the 27th chapter are the works of England of our day.

But in Ezk. 29, 30, 31 and 32, Egypt stands for the United States of America. Let us begin with the 31st Chapter. The question is asked (2d verse) "Whom art thou like in thy greatness?" The Lord, then, pro-ceeds to answer it by describing Ancient Assyria, as being the one to whom the people of the United States of America, today may be likened, and you follow this God-given description and see if it does not picture the United States. For it must be a description of some one living down in the "ends of the World" (1 Cor. 10-11), and since the time when the Assy-rian Kingdom existed, or it could not be likened to the Assyrian Kingdom in their hey-day of existence.

Now the description of the ancient Assyrian Kingdom (in Ezk. 31:3-18), is this: A tree among other big trees, but the Assyrian the biggest of them all. That is how it was back there and that is how the United States is today. That has not always been true of the United States, but since the world war, (ending 1918), the acknowledgement, (tho somewhat tacit), is already given and (for the last 10 years) has

been growing. Plants, (in the Bible prophecies) are used as symbols of nations and peoples, (Vines, trees, etc.) God's people are called His vineyard. (Isa 5:7 and others.) Here the Assyrian is represented by a cedar

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tree, in among other big trees. So if Assyria can be so represented, the United States of America, also can be represented.

Let us see clearly on this (as we go) that a symbol can be literally understood, if we take God's interpretation of it.

So this symbol of Ancient Assyria is given us as a symbol of the United States of America. And it is for us to see if this country is literally like the symbol. The United States certainly is a big tree among other big trees. (A Big Nation among other big na-tions). 3rd verse says it has four branches. Yes, the United States has them, (Philippines and other is-lands.) Also it says it has a "shadowing shroud". lands.) Yes, that is the Monroe Doctrine, covering not only its Branches, but reaching out over the continent upon which it is located. Also it is of "high stature," top being "among the thick boughs, (3d verse) stands high in the world as to learning, inventions, advan-tages, and power, and also wealth. A recent navy day editorial statement being that the "Overseas interests, foreign possessions, investments, shipping, trade and what not," (of the United States)" are ap-proximately worth Fifty Billions of Dollars," and its "National wealth foots up to something like Four Hundred Billions of Dollars."

Yes in all the details of a "high stature" (as a tree), or as a Nation, the United States of America

is (in these verses) clearly pointed out. The 4th verse (of Ezek. 31) says next "The waters nourished (margin)' him." As a tree must have, so a nation must have its suitable advantages. And it is stated that this United States was nourished and made great by "the Waters," and that "The Deeep" set him up on high," etc.

Waters can and do have (in the Scriptures) two meanings. A symbolic and a literal meaning. The symbolic is given in Rev. 17:15 as follows: "The waters which thou sawest are peoples and multiudes and nations and tongues."

In both these meanings the United States stands out as being made great by "waters." First by being a well-watered, fertile country and also by "peoples, multitudes, nations and tongues" flocking to it and thereby rapidly and substantially developing it. Oh, yes, the United States of America, as to its

rise, development and present stature, is being described here. The well-watered country, the thrifty, energetic peoples, and "The Deep," (shipping and ocean commerce) have and are all contributing to "set him up on high." (4th verse).

These are advantages that many another nation has not had. Therefore, the United States was exalted above all the trees of the field, and the United States boughs were multiplied and his branches became long, because of the multitudes of waters, (peo-

ple or armies), when he shot forth, (5th verse.) The seventh verse says "Thus was he fair in his greatness," and "the length of his branches." And the 8th verse further describes the United States of America as being in "The Garden of God." That is, it is acknowledged (by the Lord) to be making a profession of serving God. Whether they do so properly or not God has held them to be in His garden and accordingly, has done His best to cultivate them as one of His Garden plants. This of course, being true too of all nations who make this profession, and will be until the close of man's probation, when God will no longer cultivate them as His Garden but will gather

them in bundles to be burned." (Jn. 15:6.)

But we note that the United States is spoken of as being in "the Garden of God." But the thought in the 8th verse is that the United States stands HIGH (in "the Garden of God)" and that also is true of this nation. Its standing as a nation that holds many that fear God its profession, life and missionary activities (in the past) have been quite excellent, and its profession and many activities still go on. So it can literally be said in this respect also, that "The cedars in the garden of God could not hide him." "The fir trees were not like his boughs." "The Chest-nut trees were not like his branches," nor any tree in the Garden of God was like unto him in his beauty." (8th verse of Ezk. 31.)

God did all this for the United States of America, purposely, (9th verse says:) And the result has been that it has attracted world-wide attention and others have "envied him." (9th verse.)

But, sad to say, what has been the result with and upon the United States itself?

The 10th verse tells us that the United States,

has become "lifted up" in heart. This is the weakness, the tendency and the sinfulness of the human heart. Prosperity, worldly success and luxury does, always has and always will work to fill the human heart with pride, forgetfulness of God, who has blessed them and taking of the credit to themselves and depending upon themselves. It's bad tho, for it is written of God "Thine is the Kingdom, the Power And the GLORY." (Mat. 6:13.)

But even tho we may wish to do so we cannot change the picture that God has drawn of the United States of America for us to look at and be warned. Neither can we change the pronouncements that, with the warnings follow. Let us not, now, close our eyes, but with open eyes and a wise heart read those pronouncements, and especially in the next two verses, (11th and 12th). God says, (speaking of the serious thing of "Lifting up his heart.") Therefore I have delivered him into the hand of the mighty one of the heathen." (11th verse.)

Commonly, the people of the United States estimate that this couldn't be done. They think they could whip Japan, China, India and clear thru to Russia. (They and what other christendom nations would ally with them, for those are the heathen na-tions the Lord has in mind, when He makes this terrible statement, as many, many other Scriptures show.)

And personally I, myself, think it could not be done from any standpoint of human sight or reasoning. But it can be done and will be done, whether I or you, like the prospect or not. Simply, because God says it will. God is God still. And what He says goes, and will go, when, in due time, He moves His agen-cies and draws His "Glittering Sword." I hate to see it and contemplate it. And God hates to see it too, and long, long has been His extended mercy. But His statement is "My Spirit shall not always strive with man." (Gen. 6:3.)

So these things are coming. And we might as well wake up and face them. Those who don't want to repent of their sins and let God spare them, thru it all, why let them not be slow or dull and think that these well-intended, and heartily desired movements for peace are going to stop war. How idle the thought. War is in the hearts of men, (if they think they have

sufficient excuse.) And God says, "When they say Peace and Safety sudden destruction cometh." (1 Thess. 5:3.)

God says war *is coming*. He says (11th verse of Ezk. 31) I have delivered (the United States) into the hand of the mighty one of the heathen." "He," the hand of the mighty one of the heathen.' (the heathen) (and that means the nations of the far east, led by Russia and Japan.) "shall surely deal with him." And God gives as a reason for this sewith him. And God gives as a reason for this se-vere decision "I have driven (the United States) out FOR THEIR WICKEDNESS." "Wickedness," (with God) is to have "Light" and not walk in it. He that knoweth His master's will and doeth it not shall be beaten with many stripes." (Luke 12:47). (And that's right.) So the United States of America, having had (for 150 years and more) Bible Light and then do the way they are doing, are wicked with a God-estimated wicknedness, and (as already quoted), God says I have driven them out FOR THEIR WICK-EDNESS." "And strangers, the terrible of the na-tions," are to do this. They are God's instruments to punish christendom for professing Him and then not living Him.

So we see the answer to the Lord's question (in the second verse of Ezk. 31st chap.) "Whom" is (the United States of America) "like in their greatness?" And likens them to Ancient nations that rose to greatness and then were cut off and destroyed. And God repeats the question in the last verse of the chapter saying, "To whom art thou thus like in glory and in greatness among the trees of Eden?" ("Garden of God") "Yet shalt thou (the United States) be brought down with the trees of Eden, unto the neth-er parts of the earth." "Thou" (the United States of America) shalt tie in the midst of the uncircumcised (unconverted), with them that be slain by the sword." (By war.)

Then the Lord tells, (the United States) that their name is (to Him) "Egypt," by saying "This is Pharoah and all his multitude, saith the Lord God.' (Last verse of Chap. 31.)

But there is a way of escape. (An individual way.) "Whosoever will, let him come and take of the water of Life." Rev. 22:17.) But whosoever will not, must meet these things and FALL. For my part, I am taking the warning for all that it says. Am be-lieving it and teaching it and am letting Jesus live it in my heart "By Faith to keep one in it. (Eph. 3:17). So I am at peace with God and will be safe. "There shall be a time of trouble." But *at that time* thy people SHALL BE DELIVERED, every one that is found WRITTEN IN THE BOOK." Dan. 12:1.)

WHO ARE THE SAVED?

By I. C. Sultz Does the Bible teach that they are the national Jew? It does not. Does it teach that they are the ones that belong to the Catholic Church? The S. D. A.? The Mormons? Church of Christ? or any oth-er church? To all such questions the Bible answers NO. We could count more than a score of churches that claim to be the only true church. Now which one is right? I venture to say they are all wrong.

It is just as impossible for an organized church, such as we have in the world today, to be right and in harmony with God's word as it would be to make a pair of wings that would carry a man from here to the moon. Impossible? Yes, for this reason: The Bible is such a great book that it cannot all be learned in so short a time as it takes to organize a church. In order to make an organization separate and distinct from all other organizations, it is necessary to build up a creed which defines the teaching or faith, and sets the bounds over which no one dare pass. This all in the face of the fact that the scripture says, "Grow in knowledge and grace of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ.³

No matter how much light a minister may get through searching the scriptures, if it goes beyond the creed, he dare not teach it. If he does he sepa-rates himself from the denomination. By teaching the new light he simply says that he is not in harmony with the denominational creed. Therefore there is absolutely no chance for one of these churches to make any advancement. They teach that you must heed the admonition to grow while their creed forbids it.

Organized churches have ever been on a stand-still. The Methodist Church is now just where John Wesley put it at its organization in 1743, having dur-ing this time made no advancement whatever. The Roman Catholic Church is the same as when organized in 538 A. D. The S. D. A. Church is just where its organizers left it three-fourths of a century ago. So we might go through the whole list, and find that none of them have taken heed neither can they, to the admonition to "GROW IN KNOWLEDGE AND GRACE.

Having discovered this truth upon a careful study of the Bible a few years ago, I saw the necessity of separating myself from all denominations. I thank God that I have no creed to tell me what portion of the Bible to teach and what not to teach. I rejoice in the liberty that makes me free to believe, live, and teach the whole truth.

One says you must join my church to be saved: another says, you must join mine, and so on. If this is not Babylon, will someone tell me what it is. As a result of such teaching, many think that if they belong to some church they will be saved. Does the Bible teach this?

Let us see if Christ's plan includes the membership in some organized church.| His answer to the young man who wanted to know what he could do to be saved applies alike to all individuals viz: "If thou wilt enter into life, keep the commandments." Then he quotes a part of the ten showing the law to which he refers, and that he includes all of that law. This is in harmony with Jas. 2:10 which says, "For who-soever shall keep the whole law, and yet offend in one point, he is guilty of all.'

To be an offender in the eyes of God would be to refuse to do that which one knows to be right. To illustrate—as soon as I learn that the law says the seventh day is the Sabbath, and I refuse to keep it, then I become an offender and take the negative side. At that point I cease to be strictly honest with God.

The law will judge us according to our honesty or dishonesty. This is shown by the following: "For the wrath of God is revealed from heaven against all ungodliness and unrighteousness of men, who hold the truth in unrighteousness; because that which may be known of God is manifest in them, for God hath showed it unto them. For the invisible things of him from the creation of the world are already seen, being undertsood by the things that are made, even his eternal power and godhead; so that they are without

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excuse." Rom. 1:18-20.

By the above we can see that even the heathen may be saved through perfect honesty with God. He can see by the things about him that there is an all wise God over all creation. He is made with a con-science; and for the proper use of which, he alone is held accountable to God. Just to the extent that the individual yields himself to that which he knows to be right, to that extent he will be perfect, not in knowledge, but in obedience.

Paul says, "Know ye not that to whom ye yield yourselves to obey, his servants ye are to whom ye obey; whether of sin unto death, or of obedience unto righteousness?" Rom. 6:16. We might put it this way, if we have respect unto God's law, we are *His* servant, but if not, we are the servant of the devil. The other day I learned of a family who are very

strict in keeping Sunday. Doing up all the work possible the day before to get ready for what they believ-ed to be the Sabbath. They know no law for any other day as their attention had never been called to the fact that Saturday is the seventh day of the week and not Sunday. Are they offenders, and condemned for disobedience? Most certainly not. "For where no law is, there is no trangression." Rom. 5:15. As a result of perfect honesty, a steady growth in knowl-edge and grace will be obtained. This is not possible while living in harmony with a church creed.

The fidelity to church discipline instead of the Bible, is responsible for the loss of power in the churches, over which so many are lamenting today. It causes ministers to preach some things which they have learned through study are not taught by the Bible. To illustrate. The quakers teach that there is no baptism but that of the Holy ghost; absolutely contrary to the teachings of the Bible which says, "Repent and be baptized every one of you, in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ, for the remission of sins, and ye shall receive the gift of the Holy Ghost,' Acts 2:38.

He who preaches that there is no baptism but that of the Holy Ghost, after he discovers from the above scripture and others that water baptism must precede that of the Holy Ghost, is knowingly teach-ing an untruth. Such teaching condemns the preacher and lowers the spirituality of the church until criminals are at ease in its pews.

Other church creeds state that the law was done away at the cross. The ordinary lay member soon discovers that this is an error, yet he thinks that he must belong to the church in order to be saved. Paul says, "Where there is no law, there is no transgres-sion." Then if we take away the law, we take away the transgression and any thing would be right. The result of such teaching would only be to encourage sin.

Many ministers, in order to be in harmony with the creed, will stand in the pulpit and teach that the law was annulled at the cross; while he at the same time is a wilful transgressor. There is no other teaching so far reaching in its evil effects. No wonder the church has lost her power; and more than that, she has "done her do" and is doomed to destruction. Bab-ylon has become a "CAGE FOR EVERY UNCLEAN AND HATEFUL BIRD" (wicked men.) Rev. 18:2. And the wrath of God is soon to be visited upon her.

and say, what shall we do? seeing the churches them-selves have become so corrupt. I would say to such, God has never authorized his people to place their names on the book or an organized church. Of course they all claim that God organized their church, but that does not make it so. It still remains a fact that they are all man organized.

All who repent and are baptized, endeavor to keep the whole law honestly before God, earnestly study and believe the word of God with an eye single to doing his will, and accept the atonement that Christ made on the cross for our sins, have fulfilled the requirements of God and are accepted of him.

Creeds and isms are not provided for in the word of God and should have nothing to do with the life of the true christian.

The name written on the church book of the world has nothing whatever to do with it being written on the books of heaven. The whole question resolves itself into that of character, and not a question of whether or not you belong to this or that church. I once belonged to a church, and thought all or nearly all that did not believe as I did were lost. Since giving the Bible a more careful study, I am compelled to change my mind considerably. The Bible teaches us very definitely that his professed people will apostatise in the last days, and all churches are daughters of Babylon, and belong to her. God still has people in Babylon at the begin-ning of the time of trouble that must be gathered. Rev. 18:4; Jer. 51:6, 45.

The gathering out of the honest from the religious sets all over the world constitutes the gathering of the remnant (last part) of God's people. The prophet Isaiah tells us that the gathering will be like the gleaning of grapes among the branches. It will be just one or two here and there. Isaiah 17:5, 6. All of those who think that their church will be

saved, or will save them, will be sadly disappointed. That there are honest souls in all churches, there is no doubt: But as yet they have not had sufficient light to step out. As we cannot know the heart of man, we have no right to say, this one or that will be lost. "Man looketh upon the outward appearance, but God looketh upon the heart."

The strictly honest soul who is constantly seeking for added light, and places his confidence in God to lead him into all truth is building a character that will give him entrance into the kingdom of God

Some good people stand aghast at the situation,

though the road upon which he builds is very narrow. To be strictly honest nowadays means much more than many realize. How easy it is, when one needs money, to take the advantage of his neighbor when opportunity is afforded. How many who make a profession of religion cannot resist the temptation. That is why the Saviour said, "Enter ye in at the straight gate: for wide is the gate, and broad is the way, that leadeth to destruction, and many there be which go in thereat: Because straight is the gate, and narrow is the way, which leadeth unto life, and few there be that find it." Matt. 7:13, 14.

The more I study the plan of salvation as given to man, the more I see that it is wholly a matter of individual character building. This is shown by the following scripture: "For there is no respect of persons with God. For as many as have sinned without law shall also perish without law: and as many as have sinned in the law shall be judged by the law (For not the hearers of the law are just before God, but the doers of the law shall be jutified. For when the gentiles which have not the law, do by nature the things contained in the law, these having not the law, are a law unto themselves; which show the work of the law written in their hearts, their consicence also bearing witness and their thoughts the meanwhile accusing of excusing one another.)

A person may not know the written law of God but the principles are written in the heart, and he is held accountable for violating them. His conscience being the guide, which accuses or excuses.

The man who continually violates his conscience is soon like the one who gets up by the alarm clock— One morning he wishes to sleep longer, so he rolls over and takes a little nap. He gets by this way for a couple of mornings, and the next morning he wonders why he did not hear the alarm. So with the person who continually violates his conscience, he soon has it "seared as with a hot iron." 1 Tim. 4:1, 2. The sincere person cannot disregard the admon-

The sincere person cannot disregard the admonition to grow in knowledge and grace, for it is by this constant growth that the conscience becomes educated to harmonize with the perfect law of God.

Some professors of religion try to make themselves and others believe that they are honest in doing a thing which they know the Bible condemns. I know a man who professes to keep the law of God. He boasts of the law, teaches it, and says that we should live by it, then goes ahead and keeps the first day of the week for the Sabbath. It is possible to fool man, but not God.

As salvation depends upon the relation existing between the individual and God, he should belong solely to God's true church, the "CHURCH OF THE FIRST BORN", who have their names written in heaven. Heb. 12:23. Christ is the first born. It is His church, His family. If we expect to come into this family, we must be borne again. 1 Pet. 1:23. First, the sinner must be convinced of sin by the law. Rom. 3:20. Second, faith toward God. Third, repent and be baptized. Acts 2:38. Fourth, live by faith. 2 Cor. 5:7; Gal. 2:20. Fifth, declare the whole counsel of God, and seek to please him. Acts 20:27; Gal. 1:10.

The last specification will necessarily sever a person from any or all denominations, as none of them declare the whole counsel of God, but rather seek to please men.

To join a church that would prohibit me from

complying with the last mentioned specification would simply be hypocricy on my part. God's true church, the church of the firstborn is the only one that allows perfect freedom in all truth. And as long as I am in harmony with the above principles, I know that my name is written in heaven. Then should I not be satisfied?

In view of the message ("Babylon is fallen, is fallen, come out of her my people"), should we not be satisfied to remain outside of Babylon? There is not the least doubt but that creeds are responsible for the condition mentioned in Hosea 4:6 which says, "My people are destroyed for lack of knowledge, BE-CAUSE THOU HAST REJECTED KNOWLEDGE, I will also reject thee,—seeing thou hast forgotten the law of God, I will also forget thy people."

The above is a last day prophecy and vividly portrays the condition of Babylon. The reason for their destruction is because they have forgotten the law of God. Can anyone deny this charge? Certainly not, and their destruction is as sure to come as the sun rises and sets. God has placed salvation in reach of all, and has given each individual the power to choose for himself, between right and wrong. "I call heaven and earth to record this day a-

As many thinking minds are becoming considerably agitated over this question, I have written somewhat at length, with the prayer that these lines may fall into the hands of some honest soul who is seeking a way of escape from present evil conditions; or, perchance someone who is crying out, "what shall I do to be saved."

Permit me to call the attention of the reader once more to the fact, that there is but one church—THE CHURCH OF THE FIRST BORN, that will allow perfect liberty in Bible study and teaching for full christian development.

And if you in your continued evangelical work raise up a company of believers in Bible truth, never in the least degree organize them. Just tell them you are teaching them bible truth. And of course you want them to believe it, and give their hearts to God and live it. And that you hope they will, and as many as do, you want, and the Lord wants them to meet together, and if they want one to lead a meeting they can ask them to do so. And if there is a collection for some worthy cause, you can appoint some one to see that it goes to the proper place. But never organize a "church" body. If you do, you are only making possible a repetition of your experience for you or some one else.

experience for you or some one else. Now what does God want you to do about it? He wants you, now that you're out, to stay out. He would have preferred that you see this before and "come out" instead of being cast out. For he says "Come out of her (Babylon) my people." Babylon is CONTROL OF MEN BY OTHER

Babylon is CONTROL OF MEN BY OTHER MEN. Babylon does not mean *false dostrine*. God has provided for that when He says: "He (the spirit of Truth) will guide you into all Truth." But here is the crucial point. The Spirit is not allowed to have full and exclusive control. The devil gets men to become members. And a member is supposed to listen to the thing he's a member of. So we can see that Babylon is Control of Men by Other Men.

God shows us plainly where this all started. A great grandson of Noah, Nimrod by name, started it. Got them bunched up into cities and organized and under control. Gen. 10:8-10. PARAGRAPH FROM "THE YELLOW PERIL" By G. G. Rupert

Like the train traveling over the long stretch of country from New York to San Francisco, so the onward march of time brings to view new scenery in the prophetic field which has been long ago pointed out on the road of time. When the first edition of this book was printed we were soon given a glimpse of the the Russo-Japanese struggle.
