Dear Brother;

In response to your letter of Jan. 28, I am sending you the following statistics.

Number of nurses graduated from our institution during its intire existence - 217.

Year in which training of nurses began, 1893.

First class graduated in 1895.

Present number of nurses in training:

1st year class - 14

2nd " " - 14

3rd " " - 14

Number of nurses employed at present aside from those in training - 13

Of the 217 graduated we can only account for 175, as follows:

Employed in our institutions at present - 14

Employed in Conference work - 12

(Of which two are ministers and six are foreign missionaries)

In private work - 62

Other lines of work - 19

Married and in homes - 53

Physicians - 66

Known to be dead - 2

Taking medical course - 1

In our denominational schools - 4

On extended vacations at home - 2

Of those in private work some are in treatment rooms, some working in our smaller private sanitariums, and many more would be in the organized work if there was employment for them.

Of those married, many of them have married conference workers, ministers or institutional workers, so are really in partnership in the Lord's work.
