As my life has been closely
connected with this Advent message
almost from its rise, (My Father
William Adams being an active and
firm believer in the 1843-44 message)
I write out a few incidents in
compliance with Bro. Olsen's request.

I was born in 1843.

I can well remember a conference
held at Father's house in Western N.Y.
Bro. White worked in the hayfield,
to earn money for the journey;
and Father sold some sheep to get
money to send them.

This earthly all was contained
in a little black trunk without handles,
Father getting handles and putting
an it, this clothing worn to
mending, I think that was in
1847 or 8. Nearly all the Sabbath
keepers in the State of New York,
and other States were there.

His self sacrificing servants, and
the barrel of meal wasted not
neither did the gill of Oil fail.
We never knew actual want of
the necessities of life.

And when Father died about 30
years after, he sold his farm, his
estate figured up the same as
when he sold the farm.

I have been at Bro Whites when
they were at Syratogs Spa also at
Rochester New York, I helped
fold the Review when it was
printed at Auburn N.Y. also
at Rochester N.Y.

I well remember when the
first printing press was bought
A little Washington hand press,

Father was one of the committee
to help raise the money.

I well remember his saying to
Mother, No doubt we will have

to have a power press, before the end, and perhaps two, or three?)

That looked like an impossibility at that time and required a great stretch of faith. When Mother asked how it could ever be done Father replied, the Lord is able to do it when it is needed.

Perhaps he will bring some one into the truth that has one.

Those were times that called for strong faith and sacrifice, and reliance upon God.

Did God forsake his trusting children? No! No! He has led them all the way. We have only to read the statistics in the late Leon Bullittine to see what has been accomplished. The message which started in such poverty and weakness has encircled the Earth and is destined to triumph gloriously.
