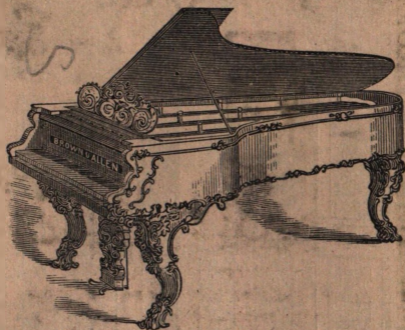

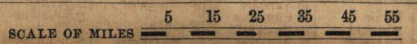

SNOW IN THE WINTER, 1855-6, at Burlington. October 25, 4 inches; Nov. 18, 1 inch; 23d, 1 inch; 25th, 1 inch; Dec. 9, 1 inch; 26th, 12 inches; 30th, 7 inches. January 3, 1 inch; 6th, 1 inch; 8th, 2 in. 14th, 5 in.; 16th, 3 in.; Feb. 17, 1 1/2 in.; Mar. 9 in. Lake froze, Feb. 1.

Mercury will be in a position favorable for visibility about January 12th, May 5th, September 1st, and December 26th; at which time the planet will be in the western sky soon after sunset; also about February 28th, June 29th, and October 19th, when it will be in the east just before sunrise.

Venus will be brightest on the 4th of April and the 15th of June, being in the west in the former case at sunset, and in the east in the latter at sunrise.

Saturn's rings will be visible the whole of 1857 with a glass of moderate size.

But *Astrology*, and all vague notions concerning the *Signs* of the Zodiac, and the government of the Moon's changes over the weather, and over the various affairs and pursuits of life, are absurdities unworthy of the intelligence of the present century.

Eclipses in 1857.

There will be two Eclipses in 1857, both of the Sun, and invisible in Vermont.

I. A total Eclipse of the Sun, March 25. The path of the central and total Eclipse will extend from Australia through the Pacific to the Gulf of Mexico. It will commence at the time of Sunset in the western part of New York, and earlier in the day westward, and be visible in all the States except in New England, New Jersey and Delaware.

II. An annular Eclipse of the Sun September 17 and 18. The middle of the Eclipse will be about the time of midnight in Vermont, or 0h. 43m. morn., and therefore invisible. The central path will begin near the south part of the Black Sea at sunrise, and end near the east part of Australia at sunset.

RATES OF POSTAGE

IN THE UNITED STATES OR TO B. N. AMER. PROVINCES.

ALL LETTERS in the United States *must be prepaid with stamps*, 3 cts. per half ounce, (fractions same,) not over 3000 miles; over 3000 miles, 10 c. Letters dropped for delivery, 1 c.; Advertised letters, 1 c. extra. To or from the Provinces, not over 3000 miles from the line, 10 c. per $\frac{1}{2}$ oz.; over 3000 miles, 15 c. prepaid or not.

Transient newspapers, periodicals, unsealed circulars, or other articles of printed matter, not exceeding 3 oz. in weight, to any part of the United States, pre-paid, 1 c.; not pre-paid, 2 c.; each additional oz. or fraction of an oz. pre-paid, 1 c.; not pre-paid, 2 c.

Regular newspapers or periodicals, paid yearly or quarterly in advance, when circulated in the State where published, not weighing over $1\frac{1}{2}$ oz., $\frac{1}{2}$ c. When circulated *out of the State*, all weighing 3 oz. or less, $\frac{1}{2}$ c.

Books, bound or unbound, not weighing over 4 pounds, 3000 miles, 1 c. per oz. pre-paid; $1\frac{1}{2}$ c. not pre-paid; 3000 miles, 2 c. pre-paid; 3 c. not pre-paid.

Letters, if in a wrapper, must be open at one end, and marked upon it except the name and address of the sender, subjects it to letter postage by weight.
